## Hot Lunch: Heather Theofanous

## Grade 7: Sylvia Cox

- 10 grade 7 parents have formed Grade 7 Parent Committee
- Class of 24 hoodies are already done and kids are wearing them constantly!
- Fundraising for Strathcona trip cost reduction (2 fundraisers)
- Hot Dog Day - Heather \& Sylvia leading - Country Grocer DONATED most of the product we need, kids set to work in 2 groups

## DPAC: Lindsay Stewart

- SD79 is rolling out the School Messenger system, moving quickly. This is part of the Safe Arrival program revamp, a combination of email, voice and texting to reach our school communities. System exists in other districts. Roll-out will come in 3 stages: district level in Feb, schools in March, and likely the classroom level in April depending how effective it proves.
- School Messenger is separate from Ride 360, although under the same umbrella. Ride 360 may start to look different as updates occur.
