Hot Lunch: Heather Theofanous

- Subway in Mill Bay has reached out as a possible vendor (we currently use Shawnigan Subway) A few different options available at Mill Bay to be considered.

Grade 7: Sylvia Cox

- Ceremony will be Wednesday June 26th at 9:30am, so cake and visiting with parents is wrapped up before recess time. All families of grade 7 students are welcome to attend.
- Danya Hillyard has agreed to lead decorating the gym on the afternoon prior.
- Sarah Doyle is working on compiling the yearbook now that (most) photos have been submitted. Thanks to Grant for getting all grade 7s to submit their written entries. Printer's estimate came in under \$800 which is well within budget.
- Giesu will turn images into a slideshow to be shown at the ceremony.
- Next committee meeting is Monday May 27th at 6:30pm.

DPAC: Lindsay Stewart

- Meeting began with a lovely presentation from Nourish Cowichan. Anyone is welcome to go visit their site to see what they do. They welcome fruit and veggie donations from the public. Their program has grown so much, their operating budget is now close to \$1million.
- Reminder of what DPAC is: DPAC reps are intended to act as a **liaison** between their school and the district. Their role is to bring concerns from schools to the district level, and provide updates from the district to their school community.
- School Messenger / Safe Arrival program now being used at a test school. Full roll-out expected for Sept '24
- Darlene Reynolds (Assistant Superintendent) spoke on the changes for QMBNS/Bonner. Many parents showed up to ask about this contentious issue, asking for clarity on how the process works, concerned with lack of consultation. As per board regulations, consultation in this kind of situation is not required. Consensus that parents did not appreciate the abrupt way it was handled. A delegation of QMBNS parents will be presenting their questions and concerns at the next SD79 meeting, which is a more appropriate audience to address these concerns.

• Next DPAC meeting is AGM - all positions to be elected. Lindsay has been serving as DPAC Treasurer and will run again for the same position. ÉCH PAC supports her nomination.

Q: How does the Fair work?

Vice Principal: Grant Mellemstrand

Year end field trips are set: grade 7 to Strathcona, grade 6 to Thunderbird, grade 5 to Camp Imadene. Due to a shortage of drivers, SD79 is having difficulty fulfilling extra bus requests. Some trips such as Strathcona will require the use of a private coach bus. End of year field trips will need to be booked early in order to secure requests.

OLD BUSINESS

- Further discussion around the idea of a Buddy Bench. Lindsay raised a request from some kids (grades k-2), that they are seeking a way to connect and make friends at recess time. While no one disagrees with the idea of Buddy Bench, perhaps these social concerns could be sorted by other means. Unfortunately, other area schools have seen Buddy Benches become a negative for many. Instead of investing in a new fixture, perhaps an existing area could be designated for kids to meet others, perhaps a sort of Buddy Club
 - Ian shared some of the strategies the school uses to help kids feel safe and socially confident at school. Recess is an opportunity for kids to engage in less structured play. It is important that kids feel safe talking to adults about various scenarios without fear of discipline
- Work order has been put in for stairs and a ramp to make the playground area more accessible. Ian continues to work with SD79 on this, but the fire suppression system replacement will take priority this summer. PAC is prepared to support with funds to make it happen when SD79 allows.

NEW BUSINESS

Appointment of interim PAC Secretary -

Erin Nicholson stepped down from this role in March. Vacancy was posted twice in the weekly bulletin. Sylvia Cox has been covering the role and will continue to do so as no others have expressed interest. Sylvia steps down as Co-Chair to fill the role of Secretary. Kathryn Wong remains Chair.
